AUSTIN COLLEGE, GRADUATE RESEARCH CENTER OF THE SOUTHWEST SIGN
RESOLUTION OF CO-OPERATION ON BEHALF OF REGIONAL EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

DALLAS--

Austin College, at Sherman, and the Graduate Research Center of the Southwest have resolved to explore patterns of co-operation aimed at bettering ^{use of} human and material resources to meet today's educational problems.

The resolution, signed by President John D. Moseley of Austin College and President Lloyd V. Berkner of the Center, was approved by the college's executive committee Friday, and will be confirmed to the Center's committee and board at meetings of January 26-27.

The specific areas of co-operation involve possible interchange of faculty members. The Center's program of basic research and advanced education in the sciences, chiefly at post-doctoral level, offers faculty members the benefits of teaching at the college. College faculty members in turn are offered opportunity to join in the program of research and advanced education.

Austin College offers a strong undergraduate program in arts and sciences, as an important factor in motivation, perspective and preparation of scientists and leaders in the Southwest.

Co-operative student participation in both Center seminars and summer research programs is another possible step.

Sharing of scientific equipment and services is listed, including the sharing of scientific information, technical competence, and other resources.

A summer colloqu^um or workshop, considering broad moral and ethical questions of science, is suggested in the resolution.

Officials of the two institutions will draft specific plans for each program to be developed, said Presidents Moseley and Berkner in the announcement. The two institutions will also explore possibilities of joint proposals to foundations and agencies for support of selected co-operative programs.

In making the announcement here, President Berkner also said that Prof. Lauriston C. Marshall, chief of scientific personnel for the Center, would serve as its representative for development of suggested programs.
