

DREYFUS FOUNDATION MAKES \$5,000 UNRESTRICTED GRANT TO GRC

Dallas, Texas --

The Camille and Henry Dreyfus Foundation, Inc. of New York City, announced by letter an unrestricted grant of \$5,000 to the Graduate Research Center of the Southwest and Southwest Center for Advanced Studies.

"We believe that the research and education work being conducted at your institution is of major significance to the State of Texas and to the nation", wrote Louise M. Lawrence, Foundation Secretary. "Dr. (Lloyd) Berkner's original aim to increase the technological capabilities in Texas by increasing the Ph. D. output also appealed to the Board of Directors of the Foundation."

The Camille and Henry Dreyfus Foundation was established by the Celanese Corporation of America as a memorial to the Dreyfus Brothers, who were the pioneers in production of cellulose acetate compounds, including safety film, aircraft lacquer, and the first acetate yarns for "artificial silk."

The Foundation's stated purposes are to advance the science of chemistry, chemical engineering, and related sciences as a means of improving human relations and circumstances around the world.

Among Dallas visitors from the Celanese Corporation and the Dreyfus Foundation to tour the Center were Dr. William L. Evers, director of University Scientific Relations of Celanese Corporation of America and director of the Foundation; and A. W. Schnizer, Manager of the Technical Center, Celanese Chemical Company, Corpus Christi.
