GRCSW OPENS DUAL ART EXHIBIT SUNDAY

An exhibit of oil paintings and sculpture by Ina Driscoll Brody will join the exhibit of ceramics, stitchery and weaving of the Richardson Civic Arts Society at the Founders Building of the Graduate Research Center of the Southwest Sunday, April 3.

The display in the first floor gallery of the Founders Building will include 22 oil paintings and 10 pieces of sculpture by Miss Brody, who studied at the Art Students League in New York City, the Yale School of Fine Arts, Academie Jullian and Ecole Dessin, both in Paris, and with Octavio Medellin and Otis Dozier of the Dallas Museum of Fine Arts. She has previously exhibited in both Connecticut and New York. Featured in the exhibit are a statue of St. Francis in cast stone and a grouping of birds in terra cotta.

In the second floor gallery, the Richardson Civic Arts Society is showing ceramics by Annelies Kahn, stitchery by Susan Brown, and weaving by Florence Hickman, Jac Brown, Gene Drummond, and Marjorie Greene.

Both exhibits will be open from 2 to 5 this afternoon. Miss Brody's exhibit will continue through April 25, and the Civic Arts Society through April. Coffee will be served visitors to the first floor exhibit this afternoon. Both exhibits will be open from 2 to 5 p. m.
