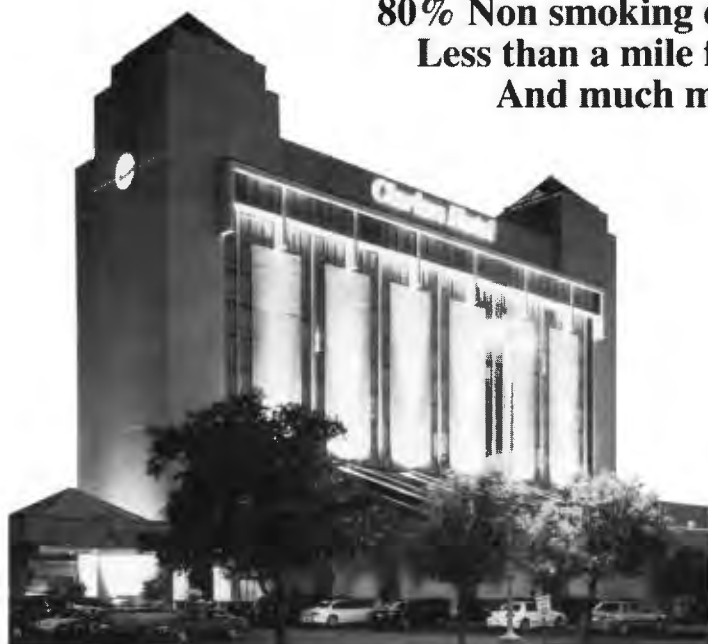




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PRESIDENT

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



The University of Texas at Dallas is entering its third year as a member of the NCAA Division III and the American Southwest Conference. In March of 1998, Mary Walters was appointed as the Athletic Director of UTD, after serving the university for 17 years as the Director of Recreational Sports. Walters will be responsible for developing a competitive athletic program that currently includes men's and women's soccer, men's and women's golf, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross-country and men's and women's tennis. Walters is a 1979 graduate of Trinity University in San Antonio, where she competed in three sports; volleyball, basketball and softball. As a senior captain, she was voted MVP and TAIAC Academic All-American in basketball. Walters also holds a Master's Degree in Physical Education from SMU. Walters is married to Mark Stoltz and they have two children, Brian, 18, and Sara, 16.

HISTORY

The University of Texas at Dallas was founded in 1969 when civic and industrial leaders Cecil Green, Erik Jonsson and Eugene McDermott, the founders of Texas Instruments, gave the Southwest Center for Advanced Studies to the State of Texas.

U.T. Dallas grew in a top-down manner: it first offered doctorate and master's degrees before accepting junior and senior undergraduate students in 1975. In 1990, UTD enrolled its first freshman class, offering a new opportunity for Texas high school senior to study in a rigorous and fulfilling academic environment.

**PHILOSOPHY AND PURPOSE STATEMENT FOR
UTD INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS**

As an integral part of the total educational program within the University, the athletic program is subject to the same aims, policies and objectives as other departments and programs on campus. The purpose of athletics at The university of Texas at Dallas is to provide competitive opportunities to students which foster physical, social and emotional benefits along with a sense of sportsmanship. In pursuit of this, the athletic department emphasizes the development of the student-athlete's mind, body and spirit in a manner complementary to the academic program and places special importance on the student-athletes instead of spectators and on the university community rather than the entertainment needs of the general public. Looking, to the future, the University has developed an expanding athletic program competing in the NCAA Division III, which exists for schools that offer no athletic scholarships, and emphasizes amateur athletics and fair play with the total well being of the student-athletes in mind. Choosing to offer athletics under those circumstances fulfills the need of those students who desire to participate in sports while pursuing a college degree. Student-athletes are reminded that above all, the main purpose of attending the college is to obtain an education.

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COMETS

The American Southwest Conference has been in existence since 1996, but its beginnings date back to 1976 with the formation of the Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association (TIAA).

The TIAA, a non-scholarship and coeducational athletic conference (the first organization of its kind in the Southwest), was formed on May 2, 1976 and consisted of five charter members-- Austin College (Sherman, TX), McMurry College (Abilene, Texas), Sul Ross State University (Alpine, Texas), Tarleton State University (Stephenville, Texas), and Trinity University (San Antonio, Texas).

Before aligning with the new TIAA organization, Sul Ross State and Tarleton State were members of the Lone Star Confer-



ence. McMurry participated in the Texoma Conference and both Austin College and Trinity were independents.

At the time of its formation, the member schools of the TIAA maintained their individual institutional affiliations with national intercollegiate athletic organizations such as the NCAA and NAIA before the confer-

ence solely became NCAA Division III.

Today, the conference consists of sixteen schools-- Concordia University at Austin, Hardin-Simmons University, Howard Payne University, McMurry University, Schreiner College, Sul Ross State University, Texas Lutheran University, University of Mary Hardin-Baylor, Austin College, East Texas Baptist University, LeTourneau University, Louisiana College, Mississippi College, University of Dallas, University of the Ozarks, and The University of Texas at Dallas.

NCAA Purpose

The purposes of this Association are:

- To initiate, stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletics programs student-athletes and to promote and develop educational leadership, physical fitness, athletics excellence and athletics participation as a recreational pursuit;

- To uphold the principle of institutional control of, and responsibility for, all intercollegiate sports in conformity with the constitution and bylaws of this Association;

- To encourage its members to adopt eligibility rules to comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship, sportsmanship and amateurism;



- To formulate, copyright and publish rules of play governing intercollegiate athletics;

- To preserve intercollegiate athletics records;

- To supervise the conduct of, and to establish eligibility standards for, regional and national athletics


events under the auspices of this Association.

- To cooperate with other amateur athletics organizations in promoting and conducting national and international athletics events.

- To legislate, through bylaws or by resolutions of a Convention, upon any subject of general concern to the members related to the administration of intercollegiate athletics; and

- To study in general all phases of competitive intercollegiate athletics and establish standards whereby the colleges and universities of the United States can maintain their athletics programs on a high level.

SEASON OUTLOOK

The UTD Women's Soccer team had its finest season ever last year (15-4-0), and looks to improve and build on last season's success. This year's freshman class is 15-strong and should give the Comets needed depth in every position with several of them expected to see significant playing time. The 2000 Comets have a schedule that is considerably more difficult, however, they feel very positive about the challenges that lie ahead.

The UTD women will look to senior captain, Heather Ramsey and junior captain, Aimee Reiners for leadership. Both players were pivotal in last season's success, with Ramsey being voted Honorable Mention All-ASC and Reiners being voted to the ASC All-Tournament team. Kristin Andrews, last year's ASC Freshman of the Year and a 1st Team All-ASC selection returns to lead the UTD goal scoring attack. Team MVP and 1st Team All-ASC selection Cara Smedley returns to anchor the ASC's leading defense. Christina Cox returns as the playmaker of the potent UTD attack, as well as the other ASC honored players; Serena Fennell, Jenny Dunn, Katy Turner and Leia Pardue. With only one senior on the team, UTD is young, but poised for long term success.

John Antonisse is entering his fourth year as Head Coach of the University of Texas at Dallas Women's Soccer Program. Previously, Antonisse was the Assistant Coach for men's and women's soccer at UTD and also spent a year as the men's and women's soccer coach at the University of Dallas in Irving, Texas.

Growing up in Richardson, Texas, he played club soccer for Sparta Blue and for J.J. Pearce High School. Both teams were perennial district and state champions. After high school, Antonisse played one year at Richland College before transferring to the University of Tulsa. While at Tulsa, he was a three-year letterwinner and was named team captain for 1984 and 1985. He graduated from the University of Tulsa in 1986 with a B.S./B.A. in Marketing.

He has earned both a National License and an Advanced National License from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, as well as USSF "A" License.

Antonisse lives in Richardson, TX, with wife Beth, sons Robert (14) and Christian (8), and daughter Jordan (11).

ASSISTANT COACH

Lisa Tomaselli

Lisa Tomaselli joins the Comets for the first time this fall. Coach Tomaselli is stepping into the field of collegiate coaching for the first time, after being a club soccer coach for several years.

Tomaselli played Division I soccer for the University of Central Florida, where she had the opportunity to compete in the NCAA Final Four in 1987. She is a native of the Dallas area, having graduated from Plano Senior High School. She was a member of the 1986 UIL State Championship team from Plano. Tomaselli was a 1st-Team All State performer and an Olympic Development National Pool Player.

Tomaselli finished her undergraduate degree at Texas A&M University, with a Bachelor of Science in Biomedical Science. She later graduated Summa Cum Laude from the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio with a B.S. in Physical Therapy. She is a licensed physical therapist and currently holds a USSF "C" License.

Tom Hart

Tom Hart is the volunteer assistant for the UTD women's soccer team. He is beginning his first season with the Comets.

Hart is well-known in the soccer community. He is the Director of Coaching Education for U.S. Youth Soccer. Hart has been Director of Coaching for youth soccer clubs since 1981. He has served as Regional or State Staff Coach for the Olympic Development Program and as a Coaching Instructor since 1984. Six of his former players have been named to U. S. National Youth Teams and one played in the 1999 Women's World Cup for Mexico.

Hart holds a Bachelor of Arts and Master of Science from Ouachita Baptist University. He currently holds a USSF "B" License.

The UTD men's and women's soccer teams compete in the American Southwest Conference, which includes 16 member institutions. These member institutions will have the opportunity to compete at the UTD soccer complex. The University of Texas at Dallas soccer facilities are not limited to the view of the university community. In 1999, the UTD athletic department advanced its soccer facilities with the help of the Lake Highlands Girls Classic League, North Texas Soccer Association, and the Dallas Cup, Inc. These soccer organizations will also use the eight soccer fields at the UTD campus.

The addition of the previously mentioned organizations, the UTD athletic and soccer programs are now subject to a vast amount of public exposure. **The Dallas Cup** is an international youth soccer tournament that will bring **160 teams from over 30 different countries** to compete at UTD. **The Lake Highlands Girls Classic League** is the most successful all-girls soccer league in the country. The league brings a total of **118 teams, offering approximately 2,000 girls** the opportunity to compete at UTD. **The North Texas Soccer Association** will bring the sub-regional Olympic Development Program to the UTD soccer fields. The program will bring **700-900 youth soccer players** to the UTD fields. The UTD men's and women's soccer program will also host five **youth soccer camps** over the summer of 2000. These camps will draw up to **500 or more young soccer players** to the UTD soccer complex.

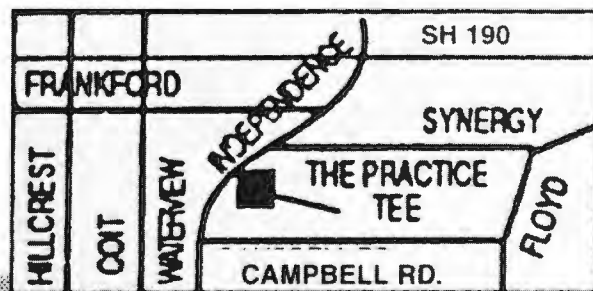

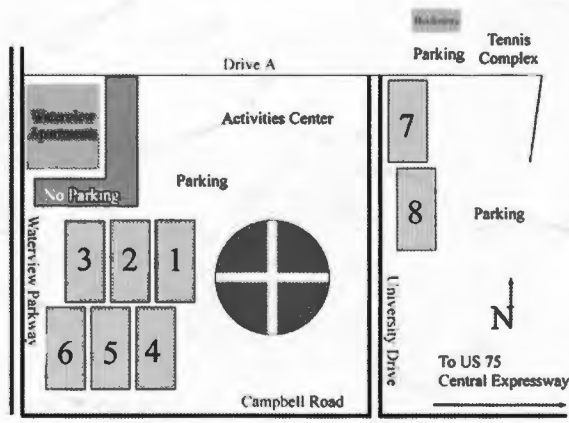
