Comets Will Be Hard-Pressed To Match Success of 2004-05

f there is one thing that a suc cessful season will do for an athletic team, it's that it creates expectations for similar results in the years that follow.

If that's truly the case, then the Comet athletic teams of 2005-06 will have a hard act to follow after one of the most successful school years in school history.

Three UTD athletic teams claimed at least a share of their respective American Southwest Conference (ASC) titles in 2004-05, with a pair of men's teams moving on to represent the con-

ference in the NCAA Division III national playoffs. All told, six of the University's seven team sport programs fared well enough last season to qualify for the conference post-season tournaments...and that even included the first-year volleyball program.

UTD's men's and women's soccer teams got the ball rolling in the fall. After a 3-4-1 start, the men's team bounced back and went 12-0-1 to claim its first ASC championship. The Comets finished conference play undefeated and held their ground on home turf in the conference tournament to win the crown and move on into the national NCAA tournament, where defending national champion Trinity ended their run, 2-0.

The UTD women were able to celebrate a conference championship of their own, albiet a shared one. The Comets fin-

ished 16-3-2, putting up 13 shutouts along the way; but staged a dramatic comeback to tie Hardin-Simmons in the league championship game, only to lose the automatic bid to the NCAA on a shootout.

The Comets won both the men's and women's ASC East Division Offensive Player of the Year awards (Ali Morshedi and Natalie Taylor).

The UTD men's basketball team put a whole new spin on "dramatic" after squeeking into their second straight conference tournament. The Cinderalla Comets got on a three-day roll and pulled a trifecta of upsets, including a 73-55 shocker over host Mississippi College in the championship game. UTD then lost a close 72-66 game to Trinity in its first appearance in the NCAA national tourney.

Baseball and softball continued their streaks of post-season play, though neither found a path all the way to the top. The Comets baseball team, which has been to the tournament three straight years, let Hardin-Simmons come from behind to eliminate it in the opening round. The UTD softball team rode a 25-17 record into another tournament berth, rallying before coming up just one win away from the championship game.

Individual athletes also excelled for UTD in cross country and tennis last year.



UT-Dallas Athletic Program Committed To Excellence

hen the University of Texas at Dallas' new president, Dr. David Daniel, took office earlier this summer, one of his first proclamations to the on-campus community concerned his commitment to making UTD a "great university." To accomplish that goal, he explained, the University was going to be "committed to excellence" in everything it did. "When we add a program," he said, "I want it to be the finest program it can possibly be."

The UTD Athletic Department, it could be said, is a step ahead in trying to achieve that standard. UTD Athletics has been "committed to excellence" since the program began more than eight years ago. "If we are going to play," UTD Athletic Director Chris Gage says, "we're going to play to win."

UTD's athletic program faces a unique challenge in that its student-athletes must not only be high achievers on the field, but in the classroom as well. With arguably the highest admissions standards of any school in the American Southwest Conference (ASC), UTD's coaches must find young men and women who can excel in both arenas.

What that challenge provides, however, is not an excuse for failure. Quite the contrary. And, succeed they have. The Comets have become "the team to beat" in just about every team sport over the past few years, and brought home three different league

championship trophies last year. In addition, studies have shown that the average cumulative grade point average of UTD's student-athlete population is actually higher than that of the general student body.

"Our student-athletes have proven that you can be both an outstanding student and an outstanding athlete," explains longtime women's soccer coach John Antonnise. "I believe athletics gives them an incentive to do well in the classroom. They learn to manage their time better, and they want to succeed in all areas of their lives."

a unique blend of opportunities – the opportunity to play highlycompetitive, Division III non-scholarship athletics while attending one of the fast-growing and most highly-respected public universities in the Southwest.

The UT-Dallas athletics program includes intercollegiate competition in...

...as part of Division III of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), which consists primarily of smaller, academically-competitive private universities from throughout the nation.

As a member of the American Southwest Conference (ASC), UTD is part of a group of universities who share a commitment to maintaining academic excellence while stressing strong intercollegiate competition. The ASC includes 16 universities throughout Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas and Mississippi. In many sports, the ASC champions also earn an automatic bid into the NCAA Division III national tournaments and other competitions. UTD became a full-fledged member in 2001; and, last year, six of the school's seven team sports programs advanced to the ASC postseason – with three claiming or sharing conference titles.

UTD student-athletes are able to train in some of the finest athletic facilities in all of Division III, highlighted by the \$11.5

million UTD Activity Center – which includes a fitness facility/weight room, swimming pool, racquetball/squash courts and a 2,500-seat arena for volleyball, basketball and other sports. The fitness area of the Center was re-



cently doubled in size with a new multi-purpose room. In the same project, UTD's Athletic Department got its own office suite and teams moved into new dressing facilities.

UTD also has its own fully-lighted soccer complex, as well as facilities for baseball, softball and tennis.

But there's more to playing intercollegiate athletics at UT-Dallas than high-caliber competition and top-notch facilities. UTD students have the opportunity to gain an education at an institution with a first-rate reputation.

The University of Texas at Dallas was originally established by the founders of Texas Instruments as a graduate research institute, but has become one of the most academically-competitive, four-year universities in the Southwest. Students are able to work side-by-side with a world-renowned faculty and assist in cuttingedge research in such fields of study as space sciences, digital encryption, audiology, and nanotechnology among others.

The UTD campus is located in suburban Richardson, Texas, 18 miles north of downtown Dallas. Students study in a quieter suburban setting, but are able to take advantage of the many recreational, cultural and sports activities of the Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan area. Rather than traditional dormitories, students at UTD live on-campus in the Waterview Park Apartments - a modern apartment complex.

ASC Celebrates 10 Years of Championship Competition

he American Southwest Conference, one of the largest intercollegiate ath letic conferences in NCAA Division III, will be crowning its 10th set of champions in 2005-06.

The ASC was founded to provide a structure for intercollegiate athletics among the member institutions, a group of 16 college and universities with similar educational and athletic philosophies. Spreading across four states — Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana and Mississippi — the ASC offers student-athletes competition in 16 sports with opportunity for advancement in both conference and NCAA Division III championships.

The American Southwest Conference has a multidimensional mission to create an environment characterized by opportunities to learn as well as provide friendly competition and activities for the conference membership. ASC members believe team and individual sports provide learning opportunities, and its membership strives to create an athletics environment supportive of teaching and learning. Traditional standards of ethical conduct and fair play are respected. To guarantee the integrity of the association, the membership adheres to the policies of the Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

ASC Championships are conducted in 16 sports (8 men, 8 women). Men's championships are offered in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis and track and field. Women's championships are offered in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and field and volleyball.

Beginning with the 2004-05 season, the ASC Presidents' Council voted to expand the playoff formats for most sports in an effort to increase the number of teams that would qualify.

In team sports where all 16 conference member schools participate, four teams from each division will qualify for an eightteam playoff tournament. In baseball, the playoffs will be broken into two parts - an open

Jacoby Brings Wealth of Experience To ASC **Commissioner Post**

red Jacoby, who led the former South west Conference (which included Texas' premier NCAA Division I institutions) for more than 11 years, is now in his 10th year as Commissioner of the American Southwest Conference.

After assuming the reins of the conference in May 1996, Jacoby has led the ASC in active expansion of its membership.

The league began with eight members in May 1996 and has grown to 16 members with institutions in Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas.

A veteran of more than 50 years in athletics administration, Jacoby's career includes eight years as an assistant football coach at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and 37 years as a college athletics commissioner beginning as the first commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference (1966-71). He served as commissioner for the Mid-American Conference (1971-82) and was commissioner of the SWC from 1982-1993. In addition to working with the ASC, Jacoby is also commissioner of the NCAA Division II Lone Star Conference.

Jacoby was presented the NACDA NIT/Athletics Director Award at the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics convention in June 2002. The award recognized Jacoby's extensive work in collegiate athletics at the institutional, conference and national levels.

A native of Logan, Ohio, Jacoby earned degrees from Ohio State University and the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He served as Chair of the National Letter of Intent Program for the longest tenure in its history - 22 years from 1973-95. Jacoby is past president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association, and past chair of several NCAA committees. He also served on the Length of Season, Officiating and Junior College Relations committees and was secretary-treasurer of the College Football Association. Jacoby currently serves on the Cotton Bowl Athletic Association Team Selection Committee.




