UTD Softball splits against LeTourneau for final home contest

Richardson, TX--The UT-Dallas Softball team found that the third time was the charm in facing LeTourneau University at home. Weather has kept the two teams from playing twice before and forced the second game to be called in the sixth inning.

The Ladyjackets capitalized on a strong hitting performance from catcher Amber Taylor who ripped a two-out, three-run double in the left center gap to take their lead to five runs. Taylor had four total RBI in the first game. LeTourneau pitcher Cari Anson allowed seven hits, but only one UTD run. Third baseman Michelle Green scored Annie Mack from third on a sacrifice fly to left for the team's only run. UTD hurler Chrissie Barnes gave up five runs on six hits, only letting up one earned run. The Comets committed three errors in the loss.

In game two, UTD pitcher Misty Green kept the Ladyjackets to just three hits and earned a shutout victory with the help of the Comet offense. Shortstop Candace Felts belted her second homerun of the season for a three-run shot to increase the Comet lead to seven. Earlier in the inning, Michelle Green was safe at first on a LU error. Christina Sass moved her over on a bunt and was also safe, setting up the Felts homer. Felts was 4-for-4 in the contest, scoring three times and driving in four runs. Centerfielder Teri Hollowell had a good two game outing, collecting three hits in five at bats, with two RBI.

The Comets are now 5-13 in the ASC East and 9-22 overall. The team travels to Texas Wesleyan for a non-conference matchup and will finish off the season with a road trip to the University of the Ozarks this weekend.
